### Learning outcomes and competences

At the end of the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:

1. Understand oral and written authentic texts, taken out of different contexts, which are adequate to their level of language competence (level A2, CEFR)
2. Use simple vocabulary and grammar structures (level A2, CEFR) correctly
3. Produce written texts of several types and on different topics, such as writing notes and short messages, besides brief private letters
4. Describe past activities, using simple past tenses, expressions of the past tense and the respective tense markers
5. Communicate in a simple form, to ask and answer questions about the family, other people, conditions of life, school life and work

### Prerequisites

Before the course unit the learner is expected to be able to: none applicable.

### Course contents

Use the Spanish language with a communicative competence of level A2 do CEFR, without neglecting the 5 linguistic skills: oral comprehension, reading comprehension, oral interaction, oral expression and written expression.

### Course contents (extended version)

1. Topics: Family, professions and works, leisure, city, festivities
2. Grammar: The alphabet. Phonetics
  - Grammatical categories: Nouns. Gender, number, agreement
  - Articles. Morphology and typology
  - Qualifying adjectives- gender, number, agreement
  - Determinative adjectives
  - Personal, demonstrative, indefinite, quantifying, interrogative, possessive pronouns
  - Adverbs, prepositions, interjections
  - Verb 'to be', general use
  - Regular verbs- all tenses
  - Basic stress rules
3. Functional Contents:
  - Giving and asking for personal information
  - Describing people physically and psychologically; Family
  - Expressing their personal tastes and ask about other people
  - Asking and answering about work and free time
  - Preparing meetings, describing places, inviting: agreeing or refusing
  - Talking about daily routine
  - Talking about experiences and actions in the past and pretensions for the future
  - Keeping short dialogues in everyday situations (in shops, restaurants, at the doctor's)
4. Vocabulary
  - the individual: physical, perceptive and spiritual dimension
  - identity and personal relationships – food, education, work, leisure
  - the media - housing, services
  - shops, health
  - travel, accommodation and transport
5. Culture
  - Territorial and administrative organization of Spain, cultural diversity- cinema, literature, music
  - Introduction to the History of Spain
  - Spain and Spanish South-American speaking countries' cultural diversity: cinema, literature, music

### Teaching and learning methods

Tasks will include: reading and listening comprehension, with a strong focus on practical activities. Communicative focus: emphasis on the use of the language as a communication means; integration of the five basic skills; advancing from simple grammar structures to more complex ones; selection of the most common and frequent vocabulary; role-playing and authentic texts.

### Assessment methods

1. Continuous evaluation - (Regular, Student Worker) (Final)
  - Intermediate Written Test - 60% (The exam comprises the previously mentioned 5 parts. At the end of the semester)
  - Practical Work - 40% (Homework or work developed in class)
2. Exam - (Regular, Student Worker) (Final, Supplementary)
  - Final Written Exam - 100% (The exam comprises the previously mentioned 5 parts)
