 - Clinical breast exam and breast self-examination
 - Changes in the genitourinary system and the breast: infectious and endocrine processes. . .
2. Climacteric
 - Physiology, clinical manifestations and diagnosis of menopause
 - Women's health during menopause
 - Psychosocial and cultural aspects of climacteric and aging
 - Healthy lifestyles in the climacteric period
 - Sexuality, sexual function and sexual dysfunctions
 - Contraception in perimenopause
 - Therapeutic measures: hormonal and non-hormonal therapy, complementary medicines
 - STIs and climacteric
 - Gynecological pathology in climacteric

Teaching and learning methods
