Teaching and learning methods

Assessment methods

1. Continuous Assessment - (Regular, Student Worker) (Final)
 - Intermediate Written Test - 60% (Comprising 5 parts: listening, Reading, writing, language use and speaking)
 - Intermediate Written Test - 20% (Mini-tests on thematic, vocabulary and grammatical areas)
 - Practical Work - 20% (Written essays done in class and at home)
2. Final exam - (Regular, Student Worker) (Supplementary, Special)
 - Final Written Exam - 100% (The final exam includes the assessment on listening, writing, reading, speaking and use of language)
