### Learning outcomes and competences

At the end of the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:

1. Identify and analyze characteristics of animated documentaries in order to recognize their potential for the construction of non-fiction narratives;
2. Understand the importance of developing specific and authorial points of view in the creation of animated documentaries;
3. Recognize the specificity and relevance of both the language of animation and its vocabulary in its suitability to themes and/or concepts of a documentary nature.
4. Develop an animated documentary valuing the different stages involved in its development.

### Prerequisites

Before the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:

1. Hands-on approach knowledge of animation technical fundamentals;
2. Hands-on approach knowledge of image editing tools;

### Course contents

Animated documentary is a film genre that emphasizes the role of animation in the creation of non-fictional narratives. We will address, in a hands-on approach, the stages of animated documentary development. This curricular unit is part of the LAB-GM guideline, which foresees the development of innovative curricular programs in which students immerse themselves in artistic research processes with themes related with mountain territories, through collaborative creation processes.

### Course contents (extended version)

1. Short history of the animated documentary, framed by the history of documentary cinema;
2. Theoretical, technical, methodological and aesthetic foundations of animated documentaries
3. Documentary development stages;
4. From idea to animated documentary narrative;
5. Discussion around the implications of the representation of the real, in the animated documentary.
6. Wells' animated documentary typologies: imitative, subjective, fantastic and postmodern.
7. Patrick's Animated Documentary Structures: Illustrative, Narrative, Sound-Based, Expanded.
8. Animation vocabulary as a strategy of unconventional and/or subjective representation of reality.
9. Processes of visual synthesis and expression of ideas. Symbolism and metaphor.
10. Hands-on approach to technical and conceptual processes of developing animated documentaries.
