Teaching and learning methods

Focus on the student-centred approach supported by task-based learning: emphasis on the use of the language as a communication tool; integration of the four basic linguistic skills: speaking, listening, writing and reading; development from simple grammar structures to more complex ones; most common and productive vocabulary; role-playing, use of authentic texts.

Assessment methods

- Continuous evaluation (Regular, Student Worker) (Final)

 Intermediate Written Test 60% (At the end of the semester, assessment of the four skills: reading, writing, listening and speaking)
 Practical Work 40% (Intermediate tests on several contents and practical work carried out at home and in the class.)
