

## Learning outcomes and competences

At the end of the course unit the learner is expected to be able to

1. Use the Spanish language with a communicative competence of level B1 according to CEFR
2. Be able to establish a bridge between previous knowledge, acquired in the lower level, and new knowledge, to enhance a positive feeling to the learning of the Spanish language
3. Demonstrate knowledge of oral and written communication by means of simple and daily tasks that demand no more than a simple exchange of information about issues that are known or recurrent
4. Describe simple aspects of their past orally and in written, as well as issues concerned with their immediate needs
5. Be aware of the differences between Portuguese and Spanish in their productions
6. Be aware of the relationship of interdependence that exists between language-learning goal and its cultural reality

## Prerequisites

Before the course unit the learner is expected to be able to
Master the Spanish language at the A2 level, without this being an impediment to attend the course.

## Course contents

Use the Spanish language with a communicative competence of level B1. 1 according to CEFR, without neglecting the 4 linguistic skills: listening, reading, speaking, and writing.

## Course contents (extended version)

1. General revision of the previous level
2. The house: description and location of objects, parts of the house, furniture and kitchen utensils
3. The city: directions and location. Means of transport
4. Verbal phrase "ir a" + infinitive
5. Travel: descriptions of spaces and countries

Comparative structures. Ask for hotel information and make reservations
6. Present perfect and past perfect
7. Food: Spanish cuisine, going to a restaurant, giving and asking for food and menu information

Affirmative imperative
8. Syntax: direct and indirect object
9. The (Spanish) preterite tense
10. Contrast between the past perfect and the preterite past tense
11. Health: body parts, physical states, verbs "ser' and "estar" (cont. ), express cause
12. Gerund: regular and irregular forms
13. Verbal phrase "estar" + gerund
14. False friends (cont.)
15. Professions

## Teaching and learning methods

Focus on the student-centred approach supported by task-based learning: emphasis on the use of the language as a communication tool; integration of the four basic linguistic skills: speaking, listening, writing and reading; development from simple grammar structures to more complex ones; most common and productive vocabulary; role-playing, authentic texts.

## Assessment methods

1. Continuous evaluation - (Regular, Student Worker) (Final)

- Intermediate Written Test - $60 \%$ (Comprises the 4 skills and grammar e vocabulary. At the end of semester.)
- Practical Work - 40\% (Mini-tests on various contents and practical work developed at home and in class.)

2. Test evaluation - (Regular, Student Worker) (Supplementary, Special)

- Final Written Exam-100\% (The exam comprises the previously referred to 5 parts with different assessment percentages.)
