Learning outcomes and competences

At the end of the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:

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 1. use the Spanish Language with a communicative competence at the level B2. 1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR);

 2. interact with native speakers in a spontaneous and fluent way;

 3. express their point of view about various current subjects and contrast opinions in many language registers;

 4. write simple and logical texts on various issues.

Prerequisites

Before the course unit the learner is expected to be able to: Master the Spanish language at the B1 level, without this being an impediment to attend the course.

Course contents

Use the Spanish language with a communicative competence of level B1. 2 according to CEFR, without neglecting the 4 linguistic skills: listening, reading, speaking and writing.

Course contents (extended version)

- . General review of the previous level
- Biographies, social relations.
 General rules and exceptions of pronunciation and spelling.
 Coordinated clauses.

- Verb tenses of the indicative: future, conditional, "mais que perfeito".

 Lexicon: world of work, advertising, journalism, vocabulary of traditions.

 Negative imperative. Passive voice.

- 8. Continuation of ser/estar (special uses), participle / gerund, verbal periphrases.
 9. More complex connectors. Formal and colloquial language.
 10. Functions: to interact socially, structure the discourse, influence the interlocutor.
