Learning outcomes and competences

At the end of the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:

1. use the Spanish language with a communicative competence of level B2. 2 CEFR, without neglecting the 4 LS: listening, reading, speaking and writing;
2. demonstrate understanding of the main ideas in complex texts dealing with concrete and abstract topics, mainly of technical nature, related to their area;
3. relate to native speakers with a level of fluency and spontaneity, enabling communication to take place without effort, bearing in mind the differences, and preventing mistakes and errors to occur;
4. produce oral and written texts about several topics that are clear and detailed and in which they uphold a personal viewpoint, referring to pros and cons of general topics.

Prerequisites

Before the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:

Master the Spanish language at the level B1, without this being an impediment to attend the course.

Course contents

Themes, linguistic items, functional writing models and texts, according to an advanced level (B2) without neglecting the 4 linguistic skills: listening, reading, speaking and writing.

Course contents (extended version)

1. General revision.
2. Verb periphrases, personal pronouns, passive voice, gerunds and participles.
3. Talking about the past, time markers, verb tenses for the past.
4. Showing agreement and disagreement. Expressing hypotheses and probability.
5. Reported speech. Repeating, counting and summarising.
6. Giving advice, expressing likes and dislikes, wishes and feelings.
7. Borrowings, false friends, idiomatic expression, specific vocabulary.
8. Abstract description and appreciation. Differences in language levels.
9. Linguistic and cultural differences and resemblances; false friends and distinctive structures.

Teaching and learning methods

Assessment methods

1. Continuous Evaluation - (Regular, Student Worker) (Final)

 - Final Written Exam - 60% (End of the semester comprising: reading, listening, writing, speaking, grammar and vocabulary)
2. Exam evaluation - (Regular, Student Worker) (Supplementary, Special)
 - Final Written Exam - 100% (Comprises: reading, listening, writing, speaking, grammar and vocabulary)
