1. Topic 1. Introduction
 - Origins of the Hispanic culture: Europe
 - Civilisation and culture: Greek, Roman, Visigoth and Arab
 - Origins of the Hispanic culture: America. The great Pre-Columbian peoples. Legends
2. Topic 2. Modern and contemporary history in Latin America
 - 15th-17th c.: Pre-Columbian America before 1492. The Conquest and colonisation. Miscegenation
 - 18th-19th c.: the first independences. Bolivar. The influence of Enlightenment and French Revolution
 - 20th c.: from past to present – from emigration to immigration. Dictatorships
3. Topic 3: Spanish American art
 - Pre-Columbian art: Aztecs, Incas and Mayas
 - Some examples of current Spanish American art: Rivera, Kahlo, Botero
4. Topic 4: History of Spanish American literature
 - Poetry. modernism, vanguardism, post-modernism, feminine poetry, social poetry and compromise poetry
 - Spanish America narrative. The new fiction from 1940 onwards. The debate on fantastic realism
 - Some authors and their works: Asturias, Rulfo, Borges, Páramo, García Márquez, Vargas Llosa
