### Course contents

This CU will enable a first contact with the world of research and this will work as a pillar for the rest of the study cycle, mainly the final training period. Moreover, the contents are directed at academic writing. Apart from research, the subject will allow information selection, acceptance of presentation norms, reflecting on the research project with true mastery of the language and of language registers to catch readers' attention, without losing sight of scientific accuracy.

### Course contents (extended version)

1. Typology and design of academic work.
2. The internship report and other assignments.
3. Organization of the workflow and time planning.
4. Some basic methodologies in the fields of Languages and Humanities.
5. Some practical questions: style manual, research in databases and libraries, references, citations.
6. Step by step: the introduction, objectives, literary review, conclusion and other chapters.
7. Plagiarism.
8. Final editing, orthography and keeping files.
