2. Use simple vocabulary and grammar structures (A1. 2-CEFR).
3. Produce written texts of several types and on different topics, according to the level (A1. 2-CEFR).
4. Use expressions and simple sentences to describe the place where they live, work, study and the people they know.
5. Communicate in a simple form, to ask and answer questions on well-known issues or related to immediate needs.

### Prerequisites

Before the course unit the learner is expected to be able to demonstrate knowledge at A1. 1 level of the language.

### Course contents

The program focuses on oral and written texts, grammatical and lexical structures adopted in the coursebook and other materials relevant to the study of language and objectives of the course.

### Course contents (extended version)

1. Topics:
  - The weather, dates, curriculum
  - Means of transport, travellings, orientation.
  - Parties, restaurants and markets.
  - On vacation, seasons of the year, tourism activities and hotels.
  - The human body, sports, health and well-being.
  - Dreamjobs, workplaces, work-life balance.
2. Linguistic Structures:
  - Modal verbs, Pronouns with the accusative
  - Prepositions and the dative
  - The use of the Perfect and the preposition of seit with dative
  - Personal pronouns in the dative, ordinal numbers, using für with the accusative
  - Placing adjectives, the interrogative pronoun Welch-, compound words.
  - Prepositions with the accusative (für, um, durch), the comparative, the pronoun es
  - Linking words

  - Practical Work - 40% (Mini-tests to evaluate specific vocabulary and grammar, as well as tasks done at home or in class.)
2. Final Exam - (Regular, Student Worker) (Supplementary, Special)
  - Final Written Exam - 100% (Listening, Writing, Reading, Speaking and Language use evaluation with different percentages.)
