Learning outcomes and competences

At the end of the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:

1. use standard Chinese with a communicative competence of A1 level, according to the CEFR, including the 5 skills
2. recognise and reproduce in their written (logograms) and oral (phonetics and tones, without resorting to "pinyin") forms all the logograms of the course, their etymology and categories
3. understand and produce sentences, texts, expressions and dialogues of frequent use in Chinese I and II, with emphasis on the use of classifying expressions (measure words) and the adnominal adjunct

Prerequisites

Before the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:
possess basic knowledge of Chinese, corresponding to the course in Chinese I

Course contents

Phonetics, grammar and vocabulary matching the level.

Course contents (extended version)

1. Phonetics
 - stress in words
 - tone changes in the cardinal numeral "um"/" (yī)
 - lexical tone and the use of rising and falling intonation in sentences
2. Grammar
 - simple sentences - subject-predicate with adjectival predicate
 - classifying expressions (measures)
 - cardinal numerals
 - demonstrative pronouns
 - prepositions
 - sentences for successive actions (specific sentences)
 - repetition functions (reduplication) of verbs in sentences
 - collocation of adnominal adjuncts
3. Vocabulary
 - teaching institutions
 - maps, cardinal points, cities, continents
 - regions and provinces in the Popular Republic of China
 - food and drinks, dishes and tastes of Chinese cuisine
 - naming the relatives according to their family relationships
 - material used for writing and studying
 - commercial institutions and currencies (money)
 - clothes
