# Learning outcomes and competences

At the end of the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:

#### Prerequisites

Before the course unit the learner is expected to be able to: Master the Spanish language at an A2 level, without it being an impediment to attend the course.

#### Course contents

Use the Spanish language with a communicative competence of level B1 according to CEFR, without neglecting the 5 linguistic skills: oral comprehension, reading comprehension, oral interaction, oral expression and written expression.

### Course contents (extended version)

- . General review of the previous level
- Biographies, social relations.
   General rules and exceptions of pronunciation and spelling.
   Coordinated clauses.

- Verb tenses of the indicative: future, conditional, more-than-perfect.

  Lexicon: world of work, advertising, journalism, vocabulary of traditions.

  Negative imperative. Passive voice.
- 8. Continuation of ser/estar (special uses), participle / gerund, verbal periphrases.
  9. More complex connectors. Formal and colloquial language.
  10. Functions: socially relate, structure the discourse, influence the interlocutor.
