Prerequisites

Before the course unit the learner is expected to be able to: have a B2 level command of the English language, though not being a constraint to attend classes.

Course contents

Linguistic items and writing models appropriate to the CEFR C1 level. Texts and vocabulary in different lexical fields, along with collocations, word families, fixed phrases, idioms and phrasal verbs. Advanced studies of grammar, functional language for writing in daily lives.
