### Course contents

The program focuses on oral and written texts, grammatical and lexical structures adopted in the coursebook and other materials relevant to the study of language and objectives of the course.

### Course contents (extended version)

1. Topics:
  - Greetings and Regards; Personal data.
  - Physical appearance. Shops and shopping. Describing oneself and others.
  - Family and friends.
  - Housing and holidays. To rent a house. Rooms.
  - Food and restaurants.
  - Travelling, environment and hobbies.
2. Linguistic structures:
  - The alphabet. Affirmative sentences. Interrogative pronouns. Formal and informal approaches.
  - Present tense. Definite and indefinite articles. Singular and Plural nouns. The interrogative.
  - Yes/No questions. Accusative with definite and indefinite pronouns. Negative using kein.
  - Personal pronouns (nominative). Possessive articles. Time expressions. The past of sein and haben.
  - Separable and inseparable verbs. Time indications. time expressions.
  - The imperative. Möchten and mögen. Expressing preferences. Impersonal pronouns.
  - Modal verbs. Dative with definite and indefinite articles. Prepositions with the dative.
