Learning outcomes and competences

At the end of the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:

- Understand oral and written authentic texts, taken out of different contexts, which are adequate to their level of language competence (A2. 2-CEFR). Use vocabulary and grammar structures (A2. 2-CEFR) correctly.
- Be vocabulty and gramma structures (az. 2-021 f) correctly.
 Produce written texts of several types and on different topics, such as writing notes and short messages, as well as letters and simple emails.
 Describe past activities, using simple past tenses, expressions of the past tense and the respective tense markers.
 Communicate in a simple form, to ask and answer questions about the family, other people, conditions of life, school life and work.
 Understand the importance of the French-speaking culture in the world.

Course contents

The course of French Language IV is based on the communicative approach of the language, on the presentation of the first grammatical structures and on the study of the phonetic, morphologic and lexical aspects. The subjects will provide knowledge of the society and the culture in the space of the French language. By the end of the UC, students must have reached the level A2. 2-CEFR, both concerning skills in comprehension (oral and written) and in expression (oral and written).

 The international organisation of the French-speaking countries
 Recognize cultural diversity within the French-speaking community
