1. Characteristics of visual language:
 - The structural elements of visual language;
 - point, line, volume, size, scale, shape, direction, color, tone, texture and movement;
 - The image - characteristics and degrees of iconicity;
 - Image production - Art, craft, design. Origin and evolution, characteristics and differentiation;
 - Visual communication and visual language - deciphering codes.
2. Composition:
 - Framing preferential points, attraction and grouping, balance, leveling, positive, negative;
 - Organization of visual perception. - Size, shape and distribution of spaces;
 - Development of composition in the field of plastic arts;
 - Two-dimensional, three-dimensional and virtual media;
3. Visual arts content:
 - Real and unreal - visual elements interaction;
 - visual language styles - notions and evolution - type and colour;
 - Invention, evocation and representation.
4. Visual Arts media:
 - Two-dimensional media - characteristics, merits and defects;
 - Three-dimensional media - characteristics, merits and defects;
 - Virtual Media-Digital Imaging - capture, editing and publishing;
 - Coordination of media.
5. Visual communication techniques.
6. Visual Literacy: Education, creativity, stereotype.
7. Practice of Visual Arts.
