 Key styles: cubism, futurism, fauvism, constructivism, suprematism

 Social and political upheavals
 Nonconformity and artistic movements of replica
 From DADA to functionalism with recovery of craftsmanship and manual making Werbund and Bauhaus
 The rediscovery of emotions, values of form and importance of the unconscious
 Key styles: expressionism, abstractionism, suprematism, surrealism, modernism

 4. The post-war, the neo-vanguards and postmodernity

 The emergence of America as a power. The power of the information society, capital and technology
 The replicates of counterculture to massification
 From the functionalism revisited with the Ulm High School of Form to anti-design movements
 Key styles: abstract expressionism, conceptual art, Pop Art, functionalism in design
 Fundamental styles; Op Art, Happenings, Street Art, Video Art, Anti-Design; Postmodernism
