Course contents

Personal attitudes, feelings, values and expectations regarding death and individual, cultural and spiritual diversity; values and philosophical principles of SC; ethical / legal principles of issues related to end-of-life care; main communication skills; standardized instruments to assess symptom severity; most common methods for relieving symptoms (pharmacological and non-pharmacological); care plan for family / caregivers; mourning process

Course contents (extended version)

 2. Establishes patient / family assessment for individualized and humanized care

 Establishes an individualized care plan

 Recognizes the patient / family's attitudes, feelings and expectations regarding illness and death

 Identifies ethical and legal issues related to end of life care

 Recognizes the more prevelent symptoms in PC

 Identifies standardized tools for symptom relief

 Integrates the most common methods for relieving symptoms (pharmacological / non-pharmacological)

 integrates into the plan the prescriptions of other professionals

 3. Understands and applies the main communication skills

 Establishes help and therapeutical relationship

 Learns how to tell bad news

 Identifies/participates iconspiracy of silence management and how to deal with uncertainty and hope

 Identifies/participates iconspiracy of silence management and how to deal with uncertainty and hope
 Collaborates in the identification of family needs
 Makes family assessment: Family APGAR, genogram, ecomap
 Participates and collaborates in the family conference
 Evaluates family / caregiver care needs
 Diagnoses caregiver enabling needs
 Collaborates in management and comfort care in the last days and hours of life
 Identifies the phases of the normal mourning process and acts accordingly
 Identifies situations of pathological mourning and acts accordingly
 Implements previously planned nursing interventions
 Evaluates the effectiveness of the interventions
