 - Knowing how to organize currently the Portuguese health system.
 - The main aspects that are contained in statutes governing its organization.
4. Health and the European Union
 - Knowing how it is developed in the European Union, the issue of health.
5. Health professional interacting with users and the multidisciplinary work team
 - Analyze and implement communication strategies for communication effectiveness.
