Learning outcomes and competences

At the end of the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:

1. Intends to start the development of psychomotor equipping of the student with a vision to acquire skills of assessment by various methods, based on the standards of practice in physiotherapy.
2. To acquire ability to assess the human body joints and muscle strength. To obtain integrated expertise of posture and movement, its amendments and mechanisms.

Prerequisites

Before the course unit the learner is expected to be able to:

1. Have the aptitude, skills and critical analysis to develop the various assessments in physical therapy.
2. Have knowledge of the English language to read and analyze the various measurement instruments.

Course contents

The theoretical-practical classes are intended to guide students to the knowledge of reference in the target content of the course (assessment / registration in physical therapy, use of various measuring instruments, postural assessment, assessment of pain and gait and goniometry) under the supervision of the teacher, also promoting space for critical discussion of the problems associated with the topics under analysis. The acquired knowledge will be applied through the completion of tasks.

Course contents (extended version)

1. Assessment in physiotherapy:
 - Records in physiotherapy
 - Physiotherapy practice standards
 - Assessment methods in physiotherapy;
 - Physiotherapy assessment
 - Subjective exam
 - Objective exam
 - Differential diagnosis;
 - Definition of the problems identified and definition of the objectives
 - Planning of treatment;
 - Assessment of posture, gait and pain.
2. Characterization, differentiation of types of pain.
3. Identification and distinction of different types of posture:
 - Postural changes and their consequences.
4. Evaluation and record keeping.
5. Assessment of gait, gait patterns.
6. Goniometry
 - Theory of measures and recording of measures:
 - Goniometry of the upper limb
 - Trunk goniometry
 - Goniometry of the lower limb.
